Call for Entries:

Eye of the Camera Exhibition at the Littleton Historical Museum, presented by The City of Littleton Fine Arts Committee has a Call for Entires.

This is the big camera photography exhibition of the year, at the Littleton Historical Museum next to the Bemis Library. *There are \$1700 in total prizes!* Entries are due January 6, 2009. The entry fee is \$30 and you are permitted three (3) total image entries.

There are some differences this year, the biggest is that your images can be submitted electronically, but you still have to send in the entry fee. Per the entry rules, the electronic images must be .jpg format. The maximum size is 3 MB, and the sizes (horizontal and vertical) are the FRAMED sizes, not the electronic image size. They give the brand of the projector as an Infocus 800, and Lee suggests submitting entries in SRGB, not RGB or CMYK (they specifically say not to use CMYK). Also, when you set your selling price, remember to include the 25% commission that the Museum collects if your image is sold.

John sent out an email with the entry flier attached. You may want to get an original copy by calling the museum at 303-795-3950. Please send an email to <u>sdehn@mac.com</u> if you would like Johns email with the attachment re-sent to you.

There is also some confusion on the entry fee. There are two prices quoted on some of the fliers. Per a conversation over the phone with a person at the museum, the entry fee is \$30.

ECC COMPETITIONS

A. Prints: 2 monochrome prints and/or 2 color prints

For prints, Fill out two photo entry forms. Attach one entry form to the back of the print and show its orientation (upper left hand corner). Give the other form to the scorekeeper. Blank entry forms may be found at <u>http://www.englewoodcameraclub.net/cgibin/competitions.cgi</u> **NOTE**: Please bring entries 15 minutes prior to the start of the meeting with the **completed Monthly Competition Forms**.

B. Digital Projected Images:

Submit up to two jpg image files by email attachment to **digital@englewoodcameraclub.net** no later than **TBD~ no entries are required for December**. Be sure to include in the file name your last name followed by the image title. Projected digital image files must be in accordance with the requirements of *Digital Projection Requirements and Guidelines* document available from the *Digital Projection* page of the Club website.

Additional competition information may be found in the *Membership Information* document available from the *Competition Information* page of the Club web site.

C. Assigned Subject Rules

On evenings when we have what we call an "Assigned" subject, (e.g. something other than "Open"), the rules about how recently the image has to have been taken are as follows: If a member enters two images in a category (such as Monochrome Prints), one, or possibly both, of them must have been taken within the previous 24 months. If you enter just one monochrome print, one color print and one digital image then all three must have been taken within the previous 24 months.

D. Altered Vs Unaltered

We only require that the image is comprised of one or more photos taken by the maker. Additional manipulation is okay. It was decided last year that beginning 2008 our club will make no distinction between "Altered' and 'Unaltered' images whether the topic is open or an assigned subject (since CCCC no longer has an Altered/Unaltered distinction in their categories).

E. PSA Entries

Only one (1) image may be entered per member. Six entries will be selected by the judge to represent ECC in each of the four competitions. Your image may be on any subject, any technique, taken any time, and it need not have been entered in ECC monthly competitions at any time. And it makes no difference if it has won an award of any kind or not; except, if it has won an award (ribbon) in a previous PSA Digital Interclub competition, it is ineligible.

Submit your ONE best image by e-mail attachment to digital@englewoodcameraclub.net no later than "next date will be announced before a PSA monthly competition". Your image file must be in accordance with the image requirements of "Digital Projection Requirements and Guidelines" document--available from the Digital Projection page of the ECC website. Please remember that JPG file size must not exceed 300 KB for PSA interclub competition.

F. Year End Competitions

The Year End and Versatility competitions are presented during the Year End banquet. The entries for 2008 have already been submitted and judged. Entries for 2009 may be submitted starting in the November meeting.

Submit your year end **Digital entries** by e-mail attachment to <u>digital@englewoodcameraclub.net</u> by **"Date is TBD (sometime in November 2009)"**.

During November 2009, if you are submitting a **digital entry for the regular** (not versatility) competition, <u>Fred Luhman</u> will already have these eligible entries on his computer system, because they will have been submitted during the current competition year. A member only has to identify entries, via e-mail, by the title and month entered. If you are submitting a **digital entry for the versatility** competition, please email your entries to the address above. For more information, refer to the Annual Competition section of the "Membership Information" document, available from the ECC website.

A panel of three judges will determine the awards, which will be presented at our year end banquet.

Regular Year-End Competition: Entries must have been entered in the ECC monthly competitions during the current calendar year; however, they need not have won an award. First, second, third, and honorable mention awards are determined for each category.

Entries may be submitted in each of the following categories:

Open Monochrome prints - 3 entries. Nature Monochrome prints - 3 entries. Open Color prints - 3 entries. Nature Color prints - 3 entries. Open Digital Projected -3 entries Nature Digital Projected -3 entries

Versatility Competition:

Entries have no time limit and need not have been submitted in a monthly competition. However, no image that was part of a group of Versatility images that won an award in a previous Versatility competition can be entered. You may enter one photo for each subject in both print and digital.

The subjects for the 2008 versatility competition were: Creativity, Western, Still Life, Insects and Blue (where the subject is blue).

Fred Luhman received an email from Joanne Stolte regarding the 2009 PSA conference that will be held in Yellowstone, MT. It looks like rooms are filling fast, if you're planning to attend you might want to make reservations now. The email is printed in its entirety here:

"Hi PSA RDs:

It appears that we will be celebrating PSA's 75th Anniversary with a large attendance at the 2009 PSA Conference in West Yellowstone, MT. Usually the Conference registration and hotel information are in the April issue of the *PSA Journal*. Based on conversations with many international members who indicated that they planned to attend and, knowing that a long time is needed to apply for a US Visa, it had been decided to have the hotel and Conference registration forms in the February issue. Unexpectedly, folks started contacting the 2009 Conference hotel to make room reservations and the hotel accepted them! **The Holiday Inn SunSpree Resort is now full.** West Yellowstone is a small area and there are two

West Yellowstone is a small area and there are two additional Conference hotels.

The **Clubhouse Inn** is one block from the Holiday Inn and is offering a \$109 PSA group rate, 800-565-6803. The **Yellowstone Lodge** is about two blocks from the Holiday Inn and is offering a \$93 PSA group rate, 877-239-9298. For comparison, the Holiday Inn's PSA group rate was \$96 for a two queen-bed room which compares to their regular room rate of about \$199 at this prime time of the year (September 20-26). If you have not made **your room reservation for the Yellowstone Conference**, I **recommend that you do so now**. You may also wish to share this information with the PSA members in your region."

The following is a re-production of an email sent out by Randy Moore with the latest CCCC news;

Dear Englewood Club Members, As promised, here is the web site for the Colorado Council of Camera Clubs: www.Coloradocameraclubs.org

If you were ever went out to the old one, you will see that this is truly a 2.0 version of it - very little of it is the same as the old site. Some of the things you can find on the new website are:

1. Calendar of events – just click on the calendar icon at the top of the page

2. Current weather stats – just click on the sun/clouds icon at the top of the page

3. People can have a link to their web site, posted on the council's web site

4. Favorite sites – these are sites that Photo

competitions, magazines, or sites that offer learning.

5. Research – listed are a couple of sites that will help you do research on a product.

6. Links to other clubs within council, and some that are not within council

I encourage you to go out and check out what the new web site has to offer – if you have ideas of how to improve it, or other links we should put in for research, or favorite sites, please let me know. (fyi – this site is only 95% done at this time, there are a few areas still being worked on, so please do not be alarmed if a link is currently not working)

A couple of things that council is going to be doing this year are:

1. Ask for critique (found on the council web site) – here you can submit a photo anonymously, where it will then be critiqued by several members of council (many of who has judged at clubs before, as well are judges for Council's quarterly competitions). You will stay completely anonymous during the entire critiquing process, both in you submitting your photograph, as well as the judges critique – all submissions and critiquing will only flow thru 1 person who will make sure that everyone's names are stripped from both the photograph, as well as the critique. If you ever wanted to get people's thoughts before entering a competition – this is now your chance. 2. Outing with an Expert – every member of council this year will be organizing an outing for club members to go on. During this outing we will have experts on had to assist you in any way to help you with your learning of photography. Whether it be working with your camera, depth-of-field, fill lighting, closeup...whatever your needs are, there will be someone on hand to assist you.

3. Workshops - will are planning several workshops this year. We will be holding a 2 day workshop on Photoshop at the end of the year, as well as some other smaller workshop thru out the course of the year – I will provide more information on these workshops as it comes up and plans are finalized. If there is a particular workshop that you are interested in, please let me know and we will see what we can do to meet that need. 4. Judges/Presenters - Council would like to start up their own database on judges and presenters so that any club can pull from the list when in need of either a judge or a presenter. With this database is what the presenter usually presents on, as well as an overall rating or how members liked that judge and/or presenter. The ranking will be from 1 to 5, 1 being "I would never use that Judge/Presenter again, and wouldn't suggest any one else do either", to 5 " this judge/presenter is one of the best we have ever had and would suggest everyone use them". Shortly, I will be sending out an email with a list of presenters, and if you know them, or remember them from a judging or presentation, asking for your thoughts on that judge/presenter.

If at any time, you have a suggestion to help us, help you, please don't hesitate in letting me know – we are here for you, that is what council is about.
